Celebrating Our Faith | by Mary Ellen Skene, Director Faith Formation

Lent can be for each of us a time of prayer—time when we spend stolen quiet moments with our God. Wonderful things happen during prayer. We encounter God in ways that go beyond pretense—beyond our own agendas. It gives us a glimpse into the person that God sees—the inner person that we all too often hide so that he may get to the heart of things and in his own gentle way transform us or give us a new perspective.

If you are looking for a way to help your children understand more about prayer teach them this lesson taken from catholicculture.org about the pretzel!

“The pretzel has a deep spiritual meaning for Lent. In fact, it was the ancient Christian Lenten bread as far back as the fourth century. In the old Roman Empire, the faithful kept a very strict fast all through Lent: no milk, no butter, no cheese, no eggs, no cream and no meat. They made small breads of water, flour and salt, to remind them that Lent was a time of prayer. They shaped these breads in the form of crossed arms for in those days they crossed their arms over the breast while praying. Therefore they called the breads "little arms" (bracellae). From this Latin word, the Germanic people later coined the term "pretzel." Thus the pretzel is the most appropriate food symbol in Lent. It still shows the form of arms crossed in prayer, reminding us that Lent is a time of prayer. It consists only of water and flour, thus proclaiming Lent as a time of fasting.”

Why not buy some frozen unbaked bread dough this weekend and make your own pretzels with your children. Tell them how it can remind them to pray and help them to imagine that the little arms of the pretzel are not only their arms in prayer but God’s arms wrapped around them every second of every day!

Certified techs will inspect or install your car seat from 9-noon on March 17

Make sure your little one is riding safely in their car seat by having it installed or inspected by the Novi Fire Department for free.

The Novi Fire Department will be conducting **free car seat safety inspections** from **9-noon on Saturday, March 17, at Fire Station #4, 49375 Ten Mile Road**. No appointments are necessary, and checks should only take about 25 minutes to complete.
